CASA FORTUNATO IN ALCÁCER DO SAL

ALENTEJO | PORTUGAL 6 BEDROOM VILLA



A sweet treasure trove of salvaged imperfections, artworks, designer icons, touchy textiles, heirloom antiques and a marriage of heritage to collectable postmodern furnishings embellish our latest design hotel outpost. Located in the cultural port town of Alcácer do Sal, Alentejo, Portugal, it's an easy 30-minute drive to Comporta and beaches of the Tróia Peninsula, and just 50 minutes drive from Lisbon.

Personally created by the owners, Filipa & Antonio of **Casa Fortunato**, a Lisbon-based architecture and design studio, the duo bring heritage builds back to life with a new sense of purpose and rooted soul, a heartfelt passion evident in this new hotel sibling. Peeling back the chapters of time and neglect, they have restored the villa into a small luxury guesthouse of six uniquely styled bedrooms and suites, a snug dining room and a courtyard garden – the hidden oasis of citrusy verts complete with a zinc plunge pool to chill down the warm summery days.

LET THE ADVENTURE BEGIN



Located in the northern part of the Alentejo region, Alcácer is one of the oldest port cities in Portugal, with a history that dates back 3,000 years when it was founded by the Phoenicians; and its position on the lifeblood river made it a valuable stop for goods heading into Europe during Roman rule, including 'sal' or salt produced locally. During the 8th century, a castle was built around the existing fortress by its Moorish inhabitants, forming 'Al-Kassr', which means castle in Arabic.



Today the town carries its rich culture alongside the day-to-day industry of this Portuguese town, where the ensemble of Roman, Islamic and Renaissance architecture in houses, churches and forts sits in harmony with markets and cafes where folk linger over a morning coffee. Authentic and slow-paced, where centuries-old craft such as embroidery and pinhoadas confectionary-making pervade – Alcácer do Sal and its cobbled streets are the real deal.



Around Casa Fortunato

If you are looking for a perfectly located retreat to spend the best of times among family, friends or organize a special gathering, Casa Fortunato is the best kept secret in Alentejo, only 80 km from Lisbon Airport.

The house is perfectly located in the village center allowing you to stroll around its beautiful and picturesque architecture, the Sado River 'Salinas', discover a handful of unique monuments and cultural sites. You may also take the chance to discover other unmissable areas of Alentejo by driving less than 1hour to visit Évora and Monsaraz or Comporta and Troia just down the corner.

Furnishings dance throughout the house like a bright harlequin with delights from a vintage Mario Bellini Sofa for B&B Italia in burnt orange, sunshine yellow Nimrod Chairs by Marc Newson, the olive green Sergio Rodrigues Cauch from the 50's, the dinning room chairs from the portuguese pioneer designer Daciano da Costa, or a seductive lounger in cornflower blues by Patricia Urquiola. Collecting post-modernist furnishings is not the only passion of António, his other eye sources lighting - a crucial element in his dialogue of curated design. Vintage Flos lamps sit nicely under a pendant light by Noguchi, or the colourful hanging Foscarni lanterns by Andrea Anastasio add an accent of the exotic, all of them in a harmonious dialogue with Plus+Minus Vibia strips and luminaires that run throughout the house.
